### From the Chair of the College Board


At the beginning of 2021, the Board had the pleasure of welcoming three new directors to the Board – Jane Watson, a lawyer from Scone and parent of an alumnus, Tom Newsome,

an Armidale businessman and St Albert's College alumnus and David Smith, a chartered accountant and the Diocesan Financial Administrator for the Armidale Diocese. The Board had a busy and productive year, as we embarked on the development of a new strategic plan for the College. Aided by an external consultant, the strategic planning process involved extensive consultation with a broad range of stakeholders culminating in a workshop with College leaders and Board members. The new strategic plan will be released later in 2022.

Recognising the important governance role of the Board, we were very fortunate that the entire Board of the College was able to undertake the AICD Company Director's Course in 2021. Completing this training together as a Board provided an invaluable opportunity to strengthen the governance of the College.

The Board is continuing with initial planning for the construction of a purpose-built chapel on the College grounds. An architect has been engaged to develop concept plans for the chapel, for the benefit of St Albert's residents, the College community and the broader UNE community. The Block refurbishment program has continued, with C Block to be completed in 2022 and E Block to be completed in time for the return of residents in early 2023.

Early in 2021, the College farewelled our longserving Principal, Jason Lincoln, who was appointed Principal of John XXIII College at the Australian National University. In May, the Board announced the appointment of Michael Holland as the new Principal of the College. Michael quickly found his feet, including navigating the College through yet another round of COVID restrictions.

Pope Francis recently published his message for the celebration of the 55th World Day of Peace. I was particularly interested in his commentary on education where he says:



### From the Chaplain


n 15th November, we celebrated the feast of St Albert the Great, our patron saint, who was described by his contemporaries (13th C.) as "godlike in knowledge...

the wonder and miracle of our age."

He is credited with introducing ancient Greek philosophers, especially Aristotle, into the early European universities. He believed in the autonomy of reason, and the need to include empirical observation and real-life experience in pursuit of truth about God. This, after all, is the logic of the incarnation, the mystery of God becoming human.

In his time, education began with what was called the Trivium (Grammar, Rhetoric and Logic), and then the Quadrivium (Arithmetic, Astronomy, Geometry and Music). Having completed about 8 years of such study, one graduated with a master of arts. Only a minority went on to then study the three great doctoral subjects of Theology, Medicine and Law.

St Albert became known as the "Universal Doctor" because his knowledge spanned the vast spectrum of all these subjects. He meticulously examined the "causes that are at work in nature", and could be described as one of the founders of the study of natural sciences in the university. As well as being one of the greatest philosophers and theologians of his age, he was an authority on mineralogy, astronomy, botany and human physiology.

Two hundred years before Columbus, he explained how the earth must be spherical. He is one of the first ever known to analyse the importance of silence in music, and is even credited with the discovery of arsenic!

It was Albert who taught St Thomas Aquinas, perhaps the greatest mind in the history of Christian thought.

What better person to have as a patron than St Albert whose advice still echoes down through the centuries: "Veritatis studium prosequi", our motto, which can be translated as "Passionately pursue the truth".


