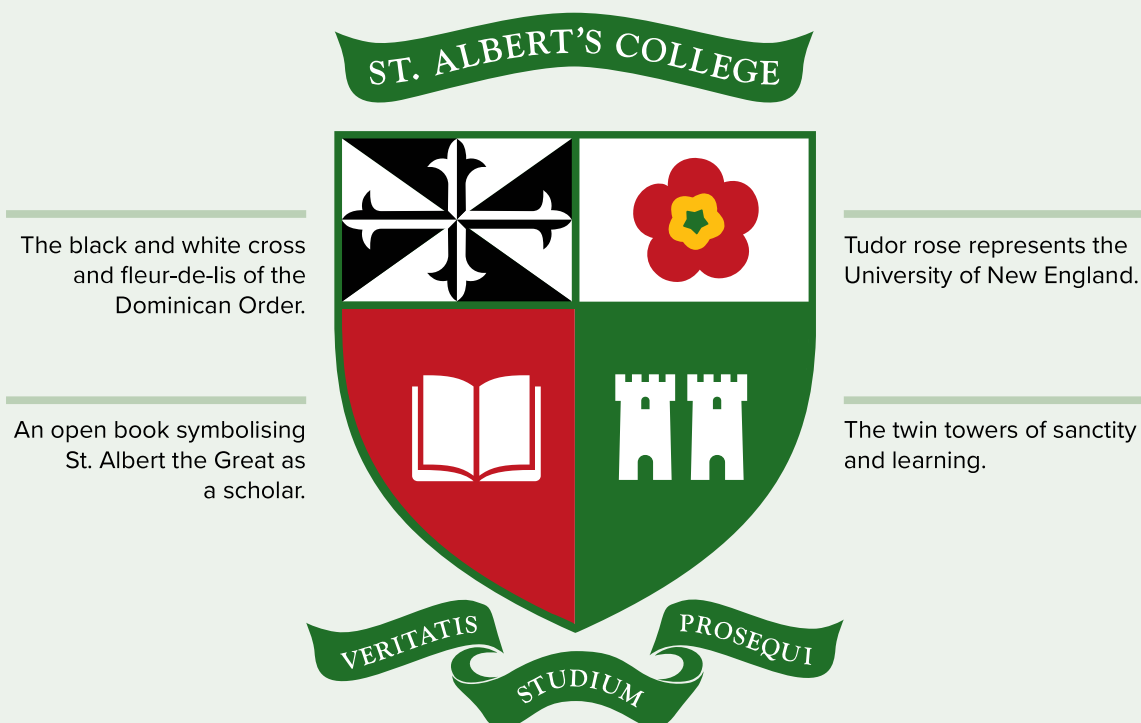
ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COUNTRY

For the College community to demonstrate leadership through:

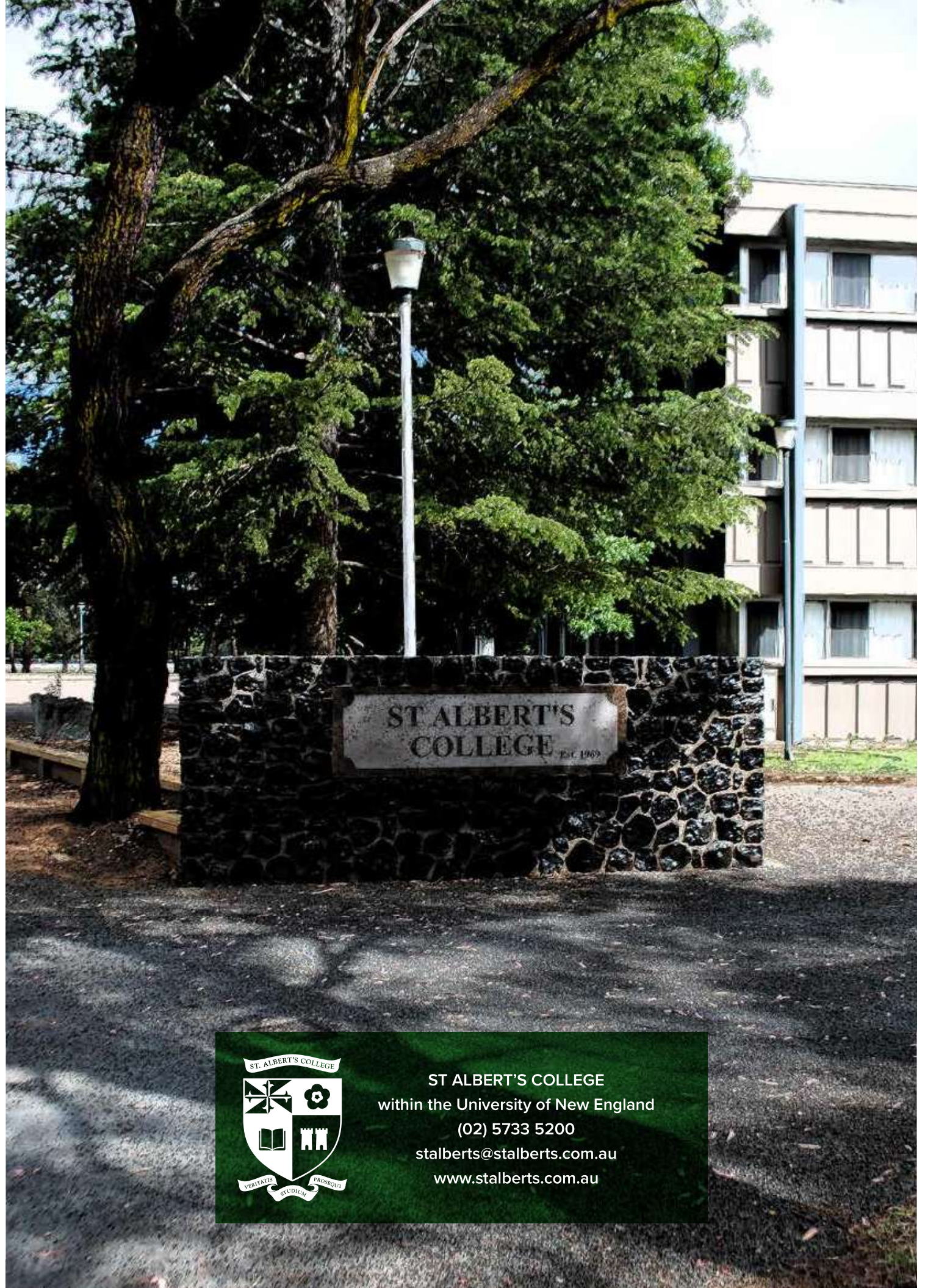
